



























RHUBARB BARS

2 cups flour

1 tsp. baking powder

1/2 cup cold butter

2 eggs, beaten

3 Tbsp. milk

5 cups sliced fresh or frozen rhubarb, thawed

1 pkg. (3 oz.) strawberry gelatin

TOPPING:

1 cup sugar

1 cup flour

1/2 cup cold butter

In a large bowl, combine flour and baking powder. Cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in eggs and milk just until moistened. Press onto the bottom of a $15 \times 10 \times 1$ inch baking pan coated with cooking spray. Top with rhubarb; sprinkle with gelatin.

For topping, in a small bowl, combine sugar and flour. Cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Sprinkle over top. Bake at 375 degrees for 40-45 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool on a wire rack. Cut into bars. Makes 3 dozen.

Hagerty youth judging program class #2 special assignment with AACA south region.

On January 29, 2012, the classic T-Bird club of South Florida held its annual classic car show at the Miami casino. Mr.Ed Raabe and I instructed a group of fifteen young children between the ages of 9 and 14 on the correct ways to judge our classic cars. This particular program was originally developed by the Hagerty Insurance Company and it has become very successful throughout the country.

Some of the AACA southern region members were present at our event and when they saw what we were doing, they followed us and began taking pictures as well as asking as many related questions. By the end of the day we were asked by them if we would consider putting the youth judging program on for their show on March 10, 2012 in the City of Homestead. Both Ed and I immediately agree and would be honored to do so.

Show day was beautiful and not like our rain and sunshine mixed day at our show back in January. The students were all active police explorers from the City of Homestead Police Dept. The show was small with approx. 45 to 50 cars in attendance. Our assignment was to judge all the vehicles and the students would be the sole judges, unlike our first class that was responsible for only judging a first, second and third place ribbon.

The students were broken down into five separate groups and each group was assigned a group of cars to judge. If one group would finish their assignment, then they would be able to assist another group.

As in many car shows, there are always some owners who prefer not to have their cars judged and that of course

helped us with our timing. Ed and I worked with them in the background, keeping things going smooth. The owners were very happy with the way the students handled themselves and in fact several owners spent extra time with them if they had a special vehicle or accessory.

Later, Ed Raabe was at the mike giving out the trophies and he did an excellent job. The program was a huge success overall at this event. Both Ed and I enjoyed working with the police explorers group, the AACA and the great people from the City Of Homestead.

On Sunday March 11, 2012, I received a pleasant phone call from Mr. Norman Kassoff (The NCAA show chairman). Mr. Kassoff advised me that after we had left, the Chief of the Homestead Police Dept. stopped by a restaurant where Norman was at. The Police Chief stated that he wanted him to know that he had met with the students and that what ever we did today with them was better than most of the programs that the police explorers have been involved in. The Chief further stated that when Norman has the certificates ready, that the certificates were be presented to the explorers by the Chief in front of the City Commission which would be a thrill for the kids.

In closing, may I add that when one gives, you never know what you will receive?





MINUTES OF MEETINGS

President Peter Klein opened the meeting at 7:40 p.m. and said the club needs people to drive cars at the RM Auction in Fort Lauderdale the weekend of March 16-18. Several members indicated they would participate in the event which will result in the auction company donating money to our club treasury.

He mentioned that our club barbecue is usually held in May. There was very brief discussion of the barbecue and it was agreed that will be talked about more at our April meeting. Christy Cos said she would talk to Daisy Hernandez about the possibility of having the barbecue at a park in Dade County.

Leo Saladino suggested we consider holding the barbecue at John U. Lloyd State Park, an oceanfront site, in Dania Beach.

Christy reported about the recent trip she and Felipe took to Israel and Jordan. She described the journey as "incredible." She said the weather was cold wherever they went and that the took a trip on a wooden boat in the Sea of Galilee; "It is a big lake."

She said that during the cruise "We heard 'Boom! Boom! Boom' and (she) said 'Felipe! The war!' It was hail." She said they drank Israeli wine which was "excellent" and that they ate "all sorts of vegetables and fruit" while they were there."

Christy said their guide on the tour was Jewish and was born in Argentina and was an archeologist who had been educated in Spain, New York and Paris and was "fantastic."

Peter told club members about attending the Milhous (private museum) auction held at the end of February at the museum site in Boca Raton. Many members of our club visited the unique collection on one of the rare occasions that was open to select visitors last year.

The entire collection -- which included antique slot machines, antique music devices, antique and vintage cars and a fully operational carousel --

sold for a staggering \$38.5 million, he said.

"I didn't buy anything, " Peter added.

He noted that many of the items sold for prices way above the pre-auction estimates.

"A model boat that was estimated to sell for between \$15,000 and \$18,000 went for \$35,000. A clock that was estimated to sell for \$50,000 to \$60,000 went for \$90,000. It was ridiculous; people were buying stuff just because they wanted it. An antique Chevrolet dealership sign with a clock estimated to sell for \$8,000 to \$12,000 went for \$72,000. The carousel (which has 42 animals, two chariots and an organ) sold for \$1,050.000. A 1951 Mercury Custom Coupe estimated to sell for 200 to 300 thousand dollars sold for \$423,000.

"It was all in the marketing. You had people there who had more money than sense. A 1912 Oldsmobile Limited five passenger touring car that was estimated to sell for between \$1.4 and \$1.6 million sold for \$3.3 million," he noted.

Ed Brown reported that he had received a thank you note from the student at McPherson College in Kansas who was the recipient of this year's award from the scholarship fund Ed created last year in memory of his late wife, Liz.

The student, from Lawrence, Kansas, is a junior at the college that offers a specialized program in antique and classic car restoration. The award was a little over \$15,000 which represents interest on the fund's principal.

Felipe reported that only one person from the AACA Board of Directors came to our club's January car show at the Magic City Casino in Miami. (the weather was bad the day of the show and the turnout was disappointingly low) He said the man is the incoming president. Felipe has served on the AACA Board.

The meeting adjourned at 9:20 p.m. We dined on the as-usual Italian fare during the meeting.
