# MINUTES OF MEETING

President, Ed Raabe opened the meeting at 7:30 p.m.

He announced that enough people had volunteered to serve as drivers in the RM Auction that was to be held at the end of the month in the Broward County Convention Center in Fort Lauderdale.

He also announced that members of our club were to place chocks at the wheels of cars going up to the auction block to make sure they don't slide backwards. The idea for the chocks was developed last year at the suggestion of Mike McNeal.

After a brief discussion of items related to our club's participation in the auction we had a break for dinner.

After dinner Ed said we will discuss the idea of special caps for club members at a future meeting.

He said he had sent members the latest club newsletter magazine as a Quarterly via computer and that he plans to resume it on a monthly basis. He mentioned that he was working with Yohanis Diaz, who had worked with Felipe on the past and was confident that we would be continuing our relations ship with her on it. He noted that some of the advertising in the newsletter has not been paid for and hopefully that situation will be remedied soon. He also said club members can place business-card sized ads in the newsletter for only \$150 for a full year.

He added that the newsletter advertising should generate about \$5,000 in revenue a year but currently is bringing in only about half of that.

Ed said he has submitted the past year's August newsletter to Barry Miller, CTCI Chairperson for the Newsletter Contest of the Classic Thunderbird Club International, for judging in the organization's annual contest for best newsletter, adding "It was done by Felipe and it would be a nice tribute to him, if it gets an award".

Our club has won awards for having an outstanding newsletter several times in recent years. The publication was put together almost entirely by Felipe Cos, our treasurer and one of the founders of the club. Felipe, as we all know, has passed and Ed has assumed the role of Editor. He said he had some big shoes to fill, but was hopeful he would be up to the task.

Ed said he was completing a CTCI Chapter Report as required annually and was surprised to learn so may Club members who owned Early Birds had either not joined or let their membership lapse.

Daisy Hernandez reported that our club currently has 51 members and 24 are not members of the Classic Thunderbird Club International.

He urged those members to enroll or renew their membership now. He said "You owners of later model Thunderbirds will benefit from the wealth of knowledge CTCI provides and may even get you to consider purchasing an "Early Bird"!"


The CTCI organization, headquartered in California, only accepts people who own 1955 through 1957 Thunderbirds. Our club welcomes people with Thunderbirds of any year.


As we walked around, we were amazed not only by the variety of the cars, but of the quality. I felt like I was in a garden of sculptures on wheels.


