MINUTES OF MEETING

President, Ed Raabe called meeting to order at 7:00pm with 24 Club members in attendance. He introduced Club member, John Layzell, who will speak about Classic Car Insurance later in the meeting.

Ed asks if everyone has been receiving the Club emails without any problems and the group replied, yes. Ed introduces the first topic on the Agenda.

SHIRTS

Peter Klein asked who, at the dinner tonight, ordered shirts because he had them with him for pickup at the end of the meeting.

Ed & Peter presented Gabriel Nash, the owner of the Trattoria Pampered Chef, with a Club shirt in appreciation for his hospitality to the Club.

Gabriel thanked everyone saying we were more than guests at his restaurant "We are like family" and "We are sad to miss Felipe and hope we see Christie at the meetings in the future."

HATS

Ed Raabe thanked Bob Ferretti for preparing photo "mock ups" of the Club Hat with the Logo for the meeting and passed them around for the members to see. He then thanked Norm Gabe for bringing his hat, white with a turquoise colored bill, for everyone to see. Then Norm says "I like this one better" and puts on the "Bull head" hat! Then a discussion about color began.

Peter Klein said "the hats should all be the same color for Club "Identity" and makes a joke "if somebody loses a hat and they find one the color will be the same!

Gail Corenblum suggested there could be a Seasonal color one for Summer in white and one for the Winter in black.

Ed said the primary reason was to show the club identity at our Club show in January and reminded Bob Ferretti about how well the white hats with the red stripe helped to identify the Corvette Club members at the Lou Bachrodt show a few months ago.

Peter" let's order one color now, then we can add to that in additional colors" and asked how many members liked black.

We voted with a show of hands on color and Black got the majority! Ernie Saladino got up and modeled the White Club shirt to show the Logo we would use!

Ed asks Peter to get some quotes for Black hats with the Club logo that is the same on the front of the shirts.

THUNDERBIRD NEWS

Ed Raabe shows a printed copy of the latest Thunderbird News, our club newsletter, telling us we are printing 20 hardcopies a month that are being sent to the current paid up advertisers at about \$7.25 a copy, including postage. He explains that we are running at a loss and that he has written to companies and persons who have advertised in the past, but have yet to renew. He also listed major insurance companies and part suppliers he has sent a letter of introduction to along with a hard copy of the Thunderbird News in an effort to increase advertising for the magazine.

Mike McNeal said "Mention the Adv. in our newsletter when buying at Concours you'll get a 10% discount of your order!

Leo Saladino asked "Can we purchase hard copies?" Ed replied that anyone who advertises receives a Hardcopy and there is a special Club member rate of \$125.00 a year for a business card sized Adv.

INSURANCE

Peter brought up the idea of approaching Insurance companies, as a Club, about obtaining a group Auto insurance discount rate and mentions 3 criteria for how premium rates are determined. How often used (rarely as most of our cars sit in the garage all year long), the value, and where they are stored.

Ed introduces John Layzell to talk about Classic Car Insurance.

John starts with "I'm the Crazy Englishman who did the Peking to Paris Rally in a red VW Beetle." "Recently I participated in The Road to Mandalay Rally in February and we only "blew" 2 engines this time!"

John then speaks about Stated Value vs. Agreed Value Car insurance and why we should all have Agreed Value Insurance on our classics. We should keep in mind the cost to replace (replacement Value)our vehicle vs the Market value (what it can bring at auction) John spoke of a Car with \$300k in restoration costs that a Major Insurance company would agree to only cover for 150k based on the current market value. "This is a car that should be appraised for its' "True value"." He said Stated Value insurance is usually used for regular every day driver cars, but If that car is modified, it to, should be appraised.

Paul asked, "Can I assume I have Agreed Value insurance if they insure my car for what I say it is worth?" John said, "don't assume anything!" He then told a story about a Mustang Cobra that got T-Boned and "totaled" before it got appraised. The owner had Stated Value Insurance and was offered \$7K but had \$17K invested just in upgrades on it!

Ed asked "if I have Agreed Value and my car is totaled" I just take the check and go buy whatever I want rather than attempt to have the car repaired, correct? John said "remember after the payoff, the Insurance Company owns the vehicle.

Leo then told the story about how he got his Mercedes back after it was "totaled"

Ed asked John to explain to the members about how the Appraisals worked and if there was a Thunderbird Club discount.

John said the price was \$350.00 for a standard appraisal of an unmodified Car and offered a 10% discount to club members and a multiple car discount.

Leo Saladino said he will check into his Condo's club facility



Agreed Value Insurance vs. Stated Value Insurance - What's the Difference?

Classic, Collectible and Custom Vehicles need to be properly insured.

Classic, Collectible and Custom automobiles have stable values and appreciate over time. Because the values are stable, an "Agreed Value" insurance policy should be obtained to protect your collectible automobiles. Under an "Agreed Value" policy, if your car is stolen or totaled, you will receive the agreed value listed in writing on your auto policy.

Most auto policies issued by major insurance companies are for "Stated Value" coverage. With a Stated Value insurance policy the insurance company decides what your Classic, Collectible or Custom car is worth at the time of the loss. Some collector policies sell Stated Value as if they were the same as "Agreed Value". They are not! Stated Value policies pay the Stated Value or the Actual Cash Value of an insured vehicle ... whichever is less.

If your auto insurance policy has an APPRAISAL Clause, it's a Stated Value Policy. Now would be a good time to review your policy and read that Appraisal clause!

Only Agreed Value Insurance coverage is without hidden gotchas. If your car is stolen or totaled, you will receive the Value Agreed to at the time you insured your Classic, Collectible or Custom car.

For custom and show cars the replacement value can greatly exceed the fair market value or actual cash value. For these vehicles it's very important to have agreed value insurance. The replacement value of your collector or show car needs to include the cost of a donor car, the cost of materials, and pay for the hours of labor to replicate these collector vehicles.

Most Agreed Value insurance issuers will insure your vehicle up to a certain amount. If you believe the replacement value is higher than the amount the insurance company will cover, you need to get an independent appraisal of value. With an appraisal, the insurance company will insure your vehicle for this amount.

An appraisal is not only important for getting an agreed value policy, but in the event of a claim against an 'at fault party' because of an accident, having your written and photo documented appraisal will be invaluable for establishing the value of your car with the at fault party.

REMEMBER:

Agreed Value Insurance = Classic, Collectible or Custom Cars

Stated Value Insurance = Daily Drivers

If YOU have stated value insurance on your collector car, get it changed ASAP!









