

Miller's Mustang Barn, Jupiter FL



An American Entrepreneur



John Staluppi


American Entrepreneur

American entrepreneur, John Staluppi with an estimated net worth of \$400 million, was born in Brooklyn NY in 1947. Growing up during the1950's, he was lucky enough to witness the golden years of the Modern American Automobile Industry, a time of style and innovation never seen before!

Staluppi began accumulating his estimated net worth when he began working as a mechanic for a Chevrolet Dealer at the age of sixteen. After proving his worth as a mechanic, his father helped him out with a \$5,000 loan against the family home to open his first Sunoco station. With hard work and creative marketing, he was able to be successful in this venture and went on to manage and own several Sunoco stations.

His successes and practical experiences encouraged him to take a risk on a venture with a then little know company, Honda to sell their Motorcycles for the first time in the U.S. Staluppi used the profits from his gas station business to invest in the fledgling company. He was able to see the potential opened a Honda shop in the early 70's. First came motorcycles, then Honda cars. After 10 years of hard work, he owned around 20 dealerships on Long Island NY and the name Honda became popular in the United States. His next venture was with Hyundai and it proved to be another success. His Dealerships now earn over 2 billion dollars annually!

Mr. Staluppi's company is now known as the Atlantic Automotive Group, one of the top 15 dealerships in the country which has the annual revenue of more than \$1 billion. He also has expanded his business interest into the yachting industry. He owns the Millennium Super Yachts, a luxury yacht manufacturer based in Florida. John had desired speed in boats ever since he was charged to install a Corvette engine in a "Fast Boat" when he worked as a mechanic for the Chevrolet Dealer in NY. Driving fast boats instantly became his second passion. It should come as no surprise with his fortune and success he began to lust after Luxury Yachts, but he wanted to own the fastest in the world and set out to do it! Named after the James Bond Blockbuster Movies he had built "For Your Eyes Only" 36m 30+ knots, "Octopussy" in 1988, the first high speed Yacht at 53 knots, "Moonracker" in 1992, 61 knots and "The World is Not Enough", capable of 70 knots but with so much power, cannot be handled safely over 63 knots! A new boat is under construction now at the time of this writing.



Also, he owns the Cars of Dreams Museum which is dedicated to cars from the 50's located in Florida. John previously sold off all the cars in the 1st collection displayed there and has now replaced them all with a new Coney Island Theme Venue, capturing the nostalgia of his youth in Brooklyn, NY. The Cars of Dreams is a Private collection available for charity functions and private viewing by Groups by appointment.





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

In the most recent monthly booklet from Early bird there was an article about ethanol fuel that is currently used in automobiles. It was pointed out that 96% of all gasoline contains at least 10% ethanol. Certain precaution and prevention should be made to safeguard the fuel system and engine components. Several problems can occur as a result of letting the fuel sit in the car for a period of time. The following problems could occur:

- 1. "when phase separation or oxidation occurs, moisture is attracted into the fuel system causing corrosion in the gas tank, fuel lines, and the fuel pump carburetor and injectors, etc.";
- "The use of oxidized fuel can create deposit buildup on the valve stems and guides resulting in stuck valves in the cylinder head."

The article listed numerous companies that have developed

products that will prevent these problems if used properly. The following were listed as product and sources:

It was pointed out that fuel will degrade into harmful products in as little as three months. If your car is not used frequently, it was recommended that Fuel System protection be added to the fuel.

Our visit to Cars of Dreams collection

Saturday, June 20

Upon entering the foyer of John Staluppi's Cars of Dreams, you knew that you were in for a treat. In the reception area, the "chandelier", (which is a clock/light fixture hanging from a single pole from the ceiling) was two complete engines, a blown Hemi racing engine alongside a blown 454.

And along the walls a perfect pair of Mopars, a Plymouth Superbird and a Dodge Daytona. My personal favorite, in this room, was the body of a Corvette, suspended above the chassis, with an incredible cut-away demonstration engine, transmission and rear end – with all moving parts! Pistons, rockers, shock absorbers, tires – everything connected, working, and absolutely fascinating. I was sorry the grandchildren hadn't joined us for the day. That display was a lesson in how a car works!

And then you enter a magical space. Every guy and girl's dream was on the floor, and the decor was perfectly fitting to round out the displays. In the center of the enormous space is a carnival bumper car pavilion. And there was so much extraordinary "eye candy" you didn't know where to look first!















A drive in movie was playing on the right wall, with Chevy convertibles lined up with speakers, 1955, '56, '57, '58, '59 – all pristine and perfect. In fact, every vehicle in the collection was perfect. And the quality of the murals on the walls and the lighting throughout just made every display a work of art.





The museum curator explained that Mr. Staluppi was a mechanic after high school in Brooklyn. His family helped him purchase a Sunoco station, and he became so successful that after owning 20 stations he was in a position to have other investments. He heard of an unknown foreign car manufacturer that wanted to come into the US, and he invested in Honda Motors. As they say, "the rest is history."

The murals and decor tell the story of John Staluppi's life. There is a two bay Sunoco station on a perimeter wall, along with an Oldsmobile dealership, a large diner, a scaled model of the Brooklyn Bridge, connecting Brooklyn to NYC (which of course has scaled models of the Statue of Liberty and the Chrysler Building). On the Coney Island side of the building there is a Nathan's Hot Dog restaurant, a Carvel Ice Cream stand, a Coney Island arcade, complete with games, clowns, rides everything to complete and compliment the theme. In the "Staluppi Collectibles" room there is a very large model train, with multi-level tracks, antique bicycles hanging from the ceiling (both a Hopalong Cassidy boy's model and a girl's - with all the leather trim!), pedal cars, model cars, as well as models of the yachts Mr. Stalluppi has owned (all named after James Bond movies), his helicopter and personal jet. And the endless props around the displays – from Elvis Presley (standing alongside his very own '67 Coupe De Ville), Betty Boop, even "Miss Hurst Golden Shifter", standing atop the trunk of a '69 Olds 442, just like at the car shows in the '60's!





The collection does not include cars of the early generations, no steam or brass. But it has every-thing else! A full line of Camaros, Corvettes from every year '54-'69, and a couple of '70's. And of course T-Birds: '55, '56 and a '57 E.





Ford Mustangs, two Ford retractables, a '57 and a '59, a superb quality '56 Lincoln Continental Mark II, Pontiacs – '69 GTO convertible, '78 Firebird Trans Am, '79 and' 80 Trans Am's, even a '57 BMW Isetta, a gorgeous '47 Bentley Mark VI, a couple of Buick Skylarks from the early '50's, a '60 Buick Invicta, convertible, of course, and Cadillacs –'49 topless roadster, '52, '57, '59 – all convertibles. And the trucks! Perfect examples of Chevy, Ford and Dodge – all just hanging out under the Brooklyn Bridge!



I almost forgot about the Oldsmobiles – both inside and outside the replica Oldsmobile showroom! Of course there was loads of muscle, and lots



of magnificent examples of fins! An unbelievable '57 DeSoto Adventurer and a Plymouth Fury convertible, but Stuart's personal favorite, a 1960 Chrysler 300 F convertible, and a '61 Chrysler 300 G, and a '57 300 C. And the damn Dodges: a '55 Royal Lancer convertible, a '64 Polara Max Wedge, a '68 Hemi Coronet convertible, and 1970 Daytona. Even a '49 Hudson Commodore convertible, a '52 Nash Rambler station wagon, a '56 Packard Caribbean convertible. The Staluppi collection doesn't have just single examples of magnificence. Multiple years are the order here!

The collection also includes street rods – gorgeous examples of modern upholstery, gauges, pristine workmanship. Driving a rod ourselves, Stuart and I were especially taken aback by the ingenuity of a creative car nut who thought to use slick, tubular rear-facing cameras in place of side view mirrors! Complete with 4" viewing screens on both sides of the dash, of course. Clever!

And every place you turned there was something else to see. The like-new, beyond beautiful, Correct Craft wooden boat set in front of its own sand beach setting, Kids' miniature riding machines – the old 10 cent rides from in front of grocery stores, pedal cars, guitars, a street vendor ice cream trike, a Wurlitzer bubble juke box, bikes, motorcycles, even an antique tractor. It is impossible to list all the contents and describe the facility with enough praise.

If you weren't able to make it on this special "field trip", and should the opportunity to view this collection ever come your way again, don't miss it. This is one special place! We're all very grateful to Peter Klein and Daisy Hernandez for putting this special event together for us!

STARTING PROBLEMS

If you are having starting problems because your engine doesn't always crank over properly when you hit the starter, the problem may be due to a poor ground connection between the engine block and the firewall or battery ground cable. It's nice to have lots of shiny paint on the engine block and firewall but remember paint won't conduct electricity and the bolt itself isn't enough surface contact to do the job.

Be sure to scrape away the paint on the engine block where the engine ground strap attaches and also for 55 and 56's where the battery ground cable is bolted. Do the same at the firewall and you will be assured of a good electrical connection.

ENGINE STARTS BUT WON'T RUN

If your 12 volt T-Bird starts OK but then dies as soon as you release the key from the start position, your problem is a defective coil resistor. If this happens you can verify that the coil resistor is defective by removing the two wires from the resistor and shorting them together. The engine should then run.

Be sure to replace the defective coil resistor ASAP or you will be putting too much voltage to the ignition circuit.

Point life will definitely be reduced and coil damage may occur when you run without the resistor.


