

Recently I needed to re-place my 29NF battery and thought I would share this information. My battery was a NAPA 7280 and the positive post came loose.

I contacted my local NAPA store in Davie and they ordered me one into that store, which arrived in 2 days! My battery was pro-rated and I received a discount. Final price \$88.00. There are a few choices as listed below, but I get a good value from the NAPA product.


Battery.

Q: WHERE CAN I GET BATTERIES FOR MY 56-57 BIRD?

A: You will be able to get batteries from any of the Bird's vendors, or you may buy them locally at various auto parts stores.

Those batteries are the large size batteries-you may ask for 29NF battery model in any brand.

This is the #1 sell by the Bird's vendors, looks like as the original one with individual vents. (Cost \$270.00)



The following are the ones that will fit in your birds: (Cost \$140.00-160.00)

#99 Thunderbird and the Great Race of 2004

Our Cover photo this month is a picture of Felipe and Chrtisty Cos's 1956 Thunderbird. In keeping with our goal to tell a short story about our members 1956 Cars, I thought we could start by honoring our founder Felipe Cos on the first anniversary of his passing on to that Great Race in Heaven, with a recollection of his participation in the Great Race of 2004

Rallye racing was a great passon of Felipe's. He would say "Car shows are for car owners, Rallyes are for car drivers, which one are you?" Not only did he race in Rallyes, he used that experience to create the Florida 300 Mile Rallye, which drew people from all over the world here to Florida to compete for a Decade! The last Rallye was held in 2014.

By 2004 The Great Race had become an American Institution. Conceived in 1983, the first Great Race started Los Angeles, CA. and followed a route to Indianapolis IN. with a winners purse of \$250,00.00 and 69 participants.

In 2004 from June 19th -July 3rd the route was Jacksonville FL. to Monterey CA. This would be Felipe's second Great race.

The race started with 110 cars. On the 4th day his car lost the transmission seal near Mt Vernon AK. Working late into the night at a nearby transmission shop by 12:30am it got fixed, but he still had to drive 3hrs to the hotel for the start of the day at 7am! If you do the math, they went out with about just 3 hours rest!

Felipe told a funny story about how his navagator, an old school pal who was living in California then, once got a "nature call" and had to stop. "Do you know much time you loose if you need to tale a "pee" break..It takes up 1 mimute and 34 seconds @ 50 mph. and you need to dirive at 55 mph for 340 seconds to make that time up". They don't call it a prescion ralley for nothing! He climbed a mountain in Utah at just 20mph and Aced the day! 11 states, rain snow and sandstorms and "amazing vistas" in 14 days.

He remembered the turnout of sometimes over a thousand spectators at the stops along the way.




80 cars finished the race and Felipe finished at 52nd , actually 21st in his class. The Winner, a 1916 Hudson, off just 1 minute and 54 seconds! I guess they didn't need to take a "pee" break! One of his best recollections was seeing Christy at the finish line in Monterey cheering him on!


Felipe's car as entered, was the #99 Thunderbird Precison Team 1956 Fiesta Red Thunderbird with the soft top, fender skirts removed and running original steel wheels. The engine had a fresh overhaul, with new rings & bearings installed and he had a special spare parts bin constructed for behind the seat, otherwise it was just the way he always drove it at home.





























16th Annual Classic Thunderbird Club SFLA Open Car Show



The 16th Annual Open car show our Thunderbird Club Sponsors is now history and once again we had a great turnout!

Over 186 cars of all kinds including 16 Classic Thunderbirds from 1955 to 1966 and a few "New Birds were on display.

The day started out early, 7am with temperatures in the low 40's, which is "way cold" for south Florida. Undaunted we arrived at the site to set up just after sunrise. Stuart and I were the first to get there, Oscar, our new club president and show organizer and Marcia followed with the tents, tables, chairs and signs. It was starting to look like it was really going to happen, but then who could doubt we would have a great show. Fortified by doughnuts and coffee courtesy of Raul and Stuart by 8:30 we were ready and the first cars began arriving just before 9am. And it was warming up to the 50s! The final temperature 62 degrees with bright sunshine and a light breeze.

Some of the unusual cars you "never see" outside of Concours shows these days were John Lazelle's 1937 Alvis Speed 25 Vanden Plas one of only three surviving out of 391produced in the world! All original and unrestored Alvis was and English Motorcar manufacturer producing 20,374 from 1920-1967

The cars were Alvis produced chassis with engine, transmission and running gear with custom coachwork, not unusual in the day. This particular car with Vanden Plas aluminum coachwork was shown in London at the 1936 Olympic Motor show!

Norm and Robin Gabe brought their wonderful 1956 Thunderbird and the newest car in their stable, a 1959 Edsel Citation. Since I also own a 1959 Edsel, this car really interested me. Edsels are a very rare site at car shows here in Florida. Norm just received his car at the beginning of the weekend, as it was an Ohio car and this was the first time at a show in Florida. We look forward to seeing it again to admire Norm's personal contributions in restoring this often misunderstood Marque.

Martin a proud 1962 Thunderbird owner also owned a 1948 Buick and is a Buick fanatic. We had the opportunity to talk to the owner of a beautiful 1954 Roadmaster Riviera Sedan equipped with factory airconditioning. The owner, Al Padilla when restoring the car insisted on an original factory air- conditioning system for his car. He was able to find a car up north that had one, he reclaimed and restored all the components, installing it to perfection right down to the clear plastic cold air delivery tubes going from the rear deck lid to the headliner. You see the evaporators where mounted in the trunk, not under the dash in those days, so the tubes needed to clear not to obstruct the rear view! This car was stunning!

The Awards table was full of beautiful trophies and the winners are chosen by only the participants. For the Thunderbirds, we have 3 Awards honoring Felipe Cos our founder. It was especially wonderful to see Christy, Felipe's wife at the show today. Grace and Martin won 1st place for their 1962 Thunderbird convertible with the roadster tonneau cover, with Ed and Raul taking the 2nd and 3rd Memorial Awards. Grace recently did some research and obtained an original copy of the sales receipt and Monroney sticker for their Bird, which is a nice addition to their storyboard.

Other cars of interest included Tony Valera's new addition, a 1950 Pontiac Catalina which won best in class even though it wasn't a Chrysler! (for those who don't know, he wins a trophy at every show for his Chrysler).

Ford was represented not just by Thunderbirds, but 2 Panteras and a half a dozen Cobras were in attendance! Michael Areas won a trophy for his 1974 Blue Pantera.

When it came to awards Jorge Del Rey walked away with 4 trophies for the cars he brought including "Best of Show" for his 1956 Chevy Bel Air.

Thanks to the great effort of Georgina, Leo and Arlene we raised \$740.00 in the 50-50 raffle! This year \$340 goes to the McPherson Automotive College scholarship in the name of Liz Brown. The Club contributes annually from the proceeds of the 50-50 raffle. Liz and Leo Smith not only won the longest distance traveled to the show, coming up from Big Pine Key, they won the 50-50 also!

We are grateful to all those Club member volunteers who contributed to the setup, registration, vote tally, front gate, parking and awards.




