# RALLY SCHOOL **Oscar Castro**

### WHAT TYPE OF RALLY:

This will be a European Style Rally, such as the Italian Mille Miglia (1,000 Miles) Rally. This will be a rally for fun with the purpose to teach you how to run a European style rally and prepare you to participate in other types of rallies. Any person that can continuously keep the same speed for 2 or 3 miles can make this rally. Once you've done one of these rallies, you can easily adapt to and follow any other type of rally.

### WHAT DO YOU NEED:

A navigator (passenger), a GPS, a stop watch, and of course, a car. There will be two classes for the competition, cars up to 1999 and from 2000 to current.

WHY THE NAVIGATOR? On the morning of the Rally, you will be issued the Rally Road Book. The book will contain turn by turn instructions which will guide you to each destination and it will also tell you what speed you must maintain between certain road markers, and you must record the time that it took you from one marker to



the other. Obviously, you cannot read the book, interpret the instructions, work the stop watch, and record the times, while at the same time, driving the automobile, that's where the Navigator comes in. The navigator will be in charge of telling you where to turn and at what speed you must





be going, he/she will also be working the stop watch and recording the times where indicated by the Rally Book. The GPS, although NOT allowed in most rallies, will be OK for this rally. Since you will not know the actual destination point of each leg, the GPS as a navigator, will not be practical, it only use will be to act as a speedometer for your vehicle. Older, and even some newer cars, are not 100% correct when indicating the speed.

Following the GPS speed you will give you a better chance of getting it right.

#### **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

All of the instructions will be relayed to you by the Navigator as he/she follows the Rally Road Book. You will be leaving from the starting point and will follow the instructions at any speed you desire until you reach the beginning of an AUTO CONTROL, indicated by an odd number, where you will START YOUR STOP WATCH and drive at the designated speed until you pass the end of the AUTO CONTROL, indicated by an even number, where you will STOP THE STOPWATCH and write your time control in the book.

You may continue at any desired speed until the next AUTO CONTROL.

Example: Numbers 1, 3, 5, etc. are all beginnings for each AUTO CONTROL, while numbers 2, 4, 6, etc., are the ending for each one. IE: 1-2, 3-4, 5-6 will be the first three AUTO CONTROLS and you will record the ending times at 2, 4, and 6.

Once you have completed all of the segments (AUTO CONTROLS) you will copy the time for each one to the appropriate space on the last page of the book. That last page will be turned in at the end of the day where we will validate your times.

Only the organizers know the exact time that it will take for you to complete each AUTO CONTROL. Provided that you maintained the constant speed as indicated, your times for each segment should match your recorded time.

Any seconds over or under will be your penalty points. We will only deduct a maximum penalty of 60 seconds for each leg.

You will each start with 1,000 points and the winner will be the one with the most points at the end.

### PRACTICE:

There will be one AUTO CONTROL at the beginning, labeled A and B, A will be the start and B will be the end. You will time this control, just as you would the regularly numbered control, ONLY, for this control, we will give you the correct answer. You should check this against your actual time and determine if you did anything wrong, should do it again to feel more at ease, or if you are right on the mark! If you do the same leg multiple times, you will most likely get as many different times, just remember, within 60 seconds either way, you are in the game. The differences may be caused because you clicked on the stop watch a little too early or a little too late, or you relaxed your foot off the accelerator, or someone got in the way and you had to compensate to the time deviance, any number of reasons!

# **INSTRUCTION (Rally Road) BOOK:**

In the instructions book you will have 7 columns:

Column #1- The instruction number.

Column #2- The approximate distance from the starting point to the designated end point of each leg.

There will not be any mileage shown on the AUTO CONTROLS.

Column #3- The approximate distance from the previous instruction to the next instruction.

This section is very important; if you have traveled this distance or more, and you have not seen the next road marker as indicated in the book, then you took a wrong turn.

If this happens GO BACK to the completion of the last instructions and try again.

Column #4- The actions you have to make [turn left, turn right, go straight, etc. etc.]

Column #5- The road sign where you initiate the previous column instruction #4; it could be a signal light, a mile marker, a speed signal, etc. etc.

Column #6- Advises the beginning and the end of the auto control

Uneven number is the beginning of AUTO CONTROL

Even number is the end of AUTO CONTROL

Also it will show the speed you have to drive at this AUTO CONTROL.

Column #7- Write your time.

Rally will start EXACTLY at 7.00 a.m. PM Friday, September 16 and will finish at the hotel.

Trophies will be presented on Saturday September 17, right after the Poolside BBQ.

You have to follow the designated speed only within the AUTO CONTROL, other than that; you may go at any speed you desire.

ALWAYS follow the speed limits AND obey all traffic laws.

In the rally you will never drive over 55 mph.

This rally "for fun" is a non-profit event; the money charged is only to cover the expenses of the rally like course preparation, books, trophies, etc..

Net proceeds will be donated to a charity. For the 2016 Rally, it will be the Cystic Fibrosis Research foundation.

This is a FAMILY event, you may bring your children, other family members, or friends in the car with you.

Be very carefully with the speed limit when you are not within an AUTO CONTROL, you will be passing several small towns with low posted limits.

# MINUTES OF MEETING

### THE MINUTES

Business Agenda item: The Felipe Cos Memorial Florida's 300 Mile Rally.

**CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was supposed to start at 6:30 but it was not called to order till 6:50PM.

Oscar handed out folders that explained the rally before the meeting started.

We were all reminded that the purpose of the rally is to have fun.

Oscar has way over 100 hours in planning this rally.

Here are some of the tidbits he gave us:

Most segments will be at 45 mph. A few will be at 35.

If you do not follow the instructions and correct yourself on wrong turns and really get lost or do not follow the directions, you are out of the rally.

We will be starting out at Sawgrass Recreation Park between 6:00 — 6:45AM. This is at Okeechobee and Griffin Road. The first car will leave at 7:00AM. You must be on time.

Only one segment is over 4 miles.

Please review the folder that Oscar gave out. He will be giving an actual bound book that will be bound together that you must follow and record in. You do not have to record mileage, only the time in whole minutes and tenths of second.

At MM 28 take time.

The mistakes in the example book will be corrected in the bound book. The actual book will have the actual segments in segments 1 & 2.

There will be 29 clues. Oscar gave us the clues for Daisy Road and Klein Street.

Breakfast will be Al Fresco in about 50 miles from the start.

where we will all regroup.

Each car will have a number on it.

Oscar Castro said we should not follow him as he is hauling water, gas, food, etc. and needs to be the first one at the stops to set up and the last one to leave to make sure everyone is on course.

It is important for the Navigator to tell the driver that he is going at the right pace and distance and tell the driver about the signs to look for.

When you are driving and following the directions please note that it might be hard to see the words: blvd. street, road.

Peter told us that Gary was involved in a car accident before the meeting.

A list with phone numbers would be good to have for the rally.

If you stop to sightsee please make sure that the other cars do not follow you in doing so.

Giovanni Gutierrez will be taking pictures and recording our wonderful weekend.

There will be a reception in town, a reception at the hotel and a wine tasting on Friday.

The hotel we are staying at is a very nice hotel, but remember it is 100 years old give or take.

No one at the meeting mentioned that they will doing the burn—out at Sebring

We don't know when we will get on the track Sunday. It will depend on when the Porsche club breaks for lunch. For that reason, we are not sure yet when we will have Breakfast. We might have it at 9:00 AM but we cannot plan the exact time now.

Sunday will be the Scavenger hunt. On Sunday we should get to Punta Gorda for lunch around 2 — 2:30.




















August 7th The Classic Thunderbird Club of South Florida members attended a wonderful brunch at the Miami Shores County Club, in Miami Shores.

----I sold my race car several years ago and was not sure what my wife and I wanted to replace it with. We narrowed it down to a 1955 or 1957 Chevrolet or a early Thunderbird. These are the cars I remember most while in high school. We saw a 1956 Ford Thunderbird on EBay in May of 2014. It looked beautiful----it was Torch Red (not original) and advertised it had an older complete restoration. I bid on the car and won! We had to pick the car up in Lakeland, Fl. This was the first time we saw the car " up close and personable ", what a surprise! I saw close to 50 pictures of the car before I bid-----let me tell you "pictures don't say a 1000 words". The car looked great from 20 feet away, but up close it needed help. I drove the car from Lakeland to our home in Fort Lauderdale. There was no A/C and the drive was uneventful, but HOT. Also, I haven't driven a car with such a large steering wheel since high school. Once the car was home, I gave it a thorough cleaning and started to buy miscellaneous parts that were missing.

We are not at our home in Fort Lauderdale year round. We spend about 6 months a year between our cabin in Helen, Ga., our house in Big Pine Key, Fl. or on an expedition somewhere in the world. About 6 months after we bought the car I noticed that the automatic transmission was leaking......so off I went to Steve at R&S Automotive who works on all my vehicles. He said that the engine would have to be pulled to have the transmission rebuilt. We have been working on the car for almost 2 years. First we had the engine and transmission pulled to repair the leaking transmission. While

the engine was out Steve suggested that while the engine was out it could use a rebuild also. So it did! While this was being done the car went to the body/paint shop for a complete restoration. Once that was done (about 6 months) the car had the engine and transmission reinstalled. After that the car came back to our home where it stayed under cover until we returned from one of our expeditions. When we came back I had the bumpers re

chromed. We are still working on the car, the major things that need to be completed are reinstalling the bumpers and miscellaneous chrome items and the interior completely refurbished. 


