



1957 Thunderbird Shooting-Brake

This story is about Duane Johnson's quest to build a 1957 Thunderbird "Shooting-Brake" We know this body style here as a "Station wagon", "Wagon" or Square-back.

The Shooting – Brake terminology was created in England to describe a vehicle Sport- Shooters would carry their guns and gear in, on the way to a Hunt. Then the term "Brake" for stowing gear used to "brakein" wild horses was added. Usually a 2-door car, they are different than 4-door "Estates", another English term for the American, "Station Wagon".

The following is Duane's own account of what happened during the build, which he graciously submitted at my request for the story including a picture of him examining the skirt.

I have added a few pictures from the Edison-Ford Winter Estate show where I first saw the car.









In August 2013, CT CI member David Tulowitzky put a picture of a 57 T-bird station wagon on the cover of their newsletter. At the time, we didn't know it was a computer generated picture. When I saw the picture, I thought that is neat, that is something I can build. After much investigation on the internet searching for the original photo, Debby found the man that made the picture. We then started looking for a car for the project, not knowing what it was going to look like. I didn't want to cut up a good car. We found a junk T— bird car in Missouri, and bought it. A building had fallen in on it, mashed the windshield frame onto the dash and mashed the right front fender really bad. It had an old Mustang engine and transmission that I didn't want. I took the engine and transmission out and traded them for some parts I needed.

I put a windshield frame and front fender on it and was able to straighten the rear quarter. I

wanted the body repaired and roughed in before I started on the top. That took to the end of 2014.

We went to Florida for the winter and came back in March 201 5. Then I found a 61 Ford Falcon two door wagon that would make a good donor top. So we went to Alabama to pick up the car. It had been sitting in a barn in the back of a field for twenty years (the keys were still in the ignition). It had no tailgate on it.

We got it home and spent a day cleaning the grass and everything the coon and ground hog had carried into the car. The car was full. I then cut the top off it and dissected the top into six pieces and put it on the body. I did the fabricating and welding while a friend of mine did the finish work Together we made a good team.

I decided I would put a modern engine in the car. It is a Ford 5.0, so it had to be a Ford engine.

Deb found a 94 Mustang GT with a 5.0 fuel injected engine and AOD transmission on the internet The price was right so ofi' to Chicago - we had another car to buy. I put that in and got it wired and ruiming. I made a custom all stainless-steel grill. I added disc brakes all around and classic air and heat and rack & pinion & steering and got it finished.

I ran into little problems here and there and worked them out. The body was finished and painted, a new headliner was installed, and we went to Florida. We came back in March 2016 and went to work finishing little things that were left. I was still waiting on bumpers from the plater, and after 6 months I finally got them back. I have made numerous other changes, and I am very satisfied with the way the car turned out. She turns a lot of heads and draws a crowd at car shows

The Auctions America crew work long into the night after we are gone, so that everything is ready to go without a hitch! Thursday






