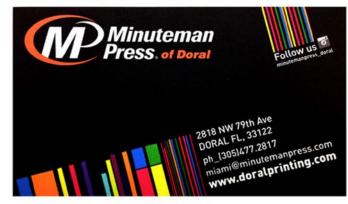


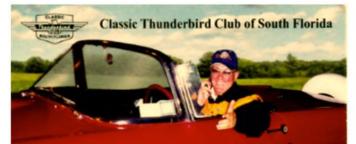

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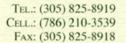


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CTCI Classic Thunderbird Club International Membership

Fellow CTCI members,

As many of you know, 2018 started off as a challenging year for our Club. At the January Annual Meeting, Lin Somsak, our award winning, Early Bird editor for over 33 years informed the Board of her desire to retire by year's end. Additionally, we received a Physician's notice that our full-time office employee, Liz Gray, was on indefinite medical leave.

And, after the Annual Meeting, Managing Director Jack Gray announced that he would be resigning.

Quite a shake up to face all at once, which was exacerbated by the fact that currently all Officers and board Members are geographically remote from the CTCI office.

It should also be noted, as many of you already know, CTCI has not been operating profitably for the past several years.

The urgent nature of these issues and their combined gravity led the Board to do an overall evaluation of our historical and current office operation. Our first priority was to find a new editor for the Early Bird, to ensure that our membership would continue to receive the fine publication that they have come to expect without interruption.

Next, we evaluated our office operations to determine if there were possible areas of savings that could lower our operating costs. We weighed the option of hiring new employees versus hiring contract services to perform some of the routine office functions as many other car clubs do. To do this evaluation, we obtained bids from two different companies that provide the services that we needed. Our research validated that significant savings could be had by using outside services to handle membership, accounting and some areas of customer service. Fortunately, our new Treasurer, Mr. John Kledis, who joined the Board last Fall, was on board to help us through this process.

As your elected Board, we have a fiduciary responsibility to protect the Club's assets and to operate the Club within the finances available and to not incur losses. That has been our goal throughout this process. And, with the new direction we have chosen, CTCI will once again operate profitably. As many of you know, CTCI maintains its principle office in Signal Hill, California. The By-Laws of our Club mandate that the principle office must remain in the County of Los Angeles, State of California.

After receiving bids and evaluating the options available to us, the Board has voted to contract with Attache International to handle the editorial function of the Early Bird and some of the office administrative functions. Attache International is an established company, located in Kansas City, Missouri, who has been providing these types of services to other car clubs and specific interest clubs for many years. The company is owned by Mr. Jim Spawn, who recently purchased a 1956 Classic Thunderbird and is a new member of CTCI. During the summer we will transition some of our office functions to them.

As a member of CTCI, it is our hope and intent that you will not see a change in service with this change. Our principle office of record will remain at our present location as required by the By-Laws. But rather than sending you your membership dues reminder ourselves, it will be sent by Attache International, as a contract company operating on our behalf. This is similar to our hiring a CPA firm to prepare our taxes, or a payroll service to handle our payroll or a fulfillment house to fill and ship merchandise order. This will not be CTCI's office. It is the location of a supplier that we have chosen to use at this time.

As we move forward, be assured that the Board will make every effort to keep you informed. In the meantime, please feel free to contact me, or any of your Board members, with any questions that you may have.

As a Board, we are optimistic that in the very near future you will be able to see the positive financial impact of this change.

The A-432 Spacer

The following article was reprinted with the permission of Chris Ames. Creator of A-432 and Editor of the Arizona CTCI Chapter newsletter Arizona Bird Chatter.

Like many of us, Chris sought a solution to the problem of our Thunderbirds running hot and overheating, especially in parades and traffic. He went a really found a solution!

The short story is, when Ford dropped the 292 Y Block into the Thunderbird they added a spacer between the timing cover and the water pump, to configure it to fit in the Bay. Engines installed into sedans did not need this spacer. However, the inherent poor design of the OEM spacer greatly effects water flow into the engine block, effectively preventing water to flow under 1000 rpm!

Chris enrolled in a Thermal Fluids Engineering Class at Arizona State University to meet this challenge. The full article can be seen in Early Bird Jan-Feb 2018 pg.34

The Challenge _____ by Chris Ames

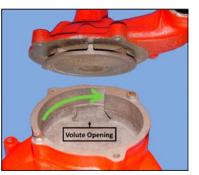
We live in Phoenix and have owned our '56 Thunderbird since 2003. Driving our T-Bird over the first 13 years was frequently a struggle with engine cooling system. While Classic Thunderbirds are excellent parade cars, even driving in our Thanksgiving Day Parade that starts at 9:00 AM and only takes 20 minutes was a challenge.

In 2014 we had the engine rebuilt which launched a project that resulted in the redesign of the water pump spacer and ultimately the manufacturing of that spacer.

I detailed the effort in an article titled Eureka Moment with Engine Cooling published in the 2017 January-February issue of Classic Thunderbird Club International's Early Bird magazine. The article may be downloaded from: Eureka Moment with Engine Cooling.

In this illustration, an OEM spacer is in-place on a timing chain cover with a water pump in relative position above.

With the water pump installed on the spacer, again, the center of the impeller vanes is approximately at the point of the flow arrow. Centrifugal force keeps the fastest moving coolant to

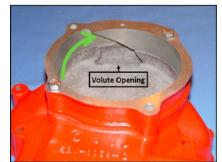

Here a patent-pending A-432 spacer is in place on the timing chain cover. With the water pump mounted front of the A-432 spacer, again, the center of the impeller vanes is approximately at the point of the flow arrow, and centrifugal force keeps the fastest moving coolant to the



outer circumference of the spacer chamber. Coolant departs the impeller vanes and contacts the volute extension at approximately a 30-degree angle. The volute extension channels the coolant flow rearward into the volute opening, reducing turbulence and increasing flow.

And the A-432 is cast iron with the same external contours and sand cast finish as the OEM version.

Comparison of Spacers Bolted To The Water Pump

In the OEM spacer, the coolant flows from the impeller vanes to the offset in the interior circumference at 90 degrees generating turbulence.

With the A-432 Spacer coolant flows from impeller vanes to the volute extension which channels the flow to the opening in the timing chain cove.

I asked Chris about availability and the response he is getting to the A-432 spacer and this was his reply. Included is a link to a website you can visit.

We have been shipping for just over a year and have sent three to Norway, two to Australia, one to England and one via Ted Eaton, France.

We generally email an invoice within a day of receiving a request and ship when we receive a check, money order or PayPal transfer. I will work to respond to emergency situations, for example, a car with an OEM spacer damaged, or if someone car has a pump failure and they want to install the A-432 with the new pump.

We ship weekday receipts the same day, Saturday depends on the mail delivery time. We send via USPS Priority Mail Padded Flat Rate Envelope which is delivered within three days domestically. The spacer weights 2 lbs., 6 oz, so the Priority Flat Rate is the least expensive shipping option and it is undoubtedly quicker.

I have received positive feedback from some very dedicated engine builders. Ted Eaton from Lorena, Texas is a regular contributor to Y-BLOCK MAGAZINE and owner of Ted Eaton Specialty. If you are a fan Hot Rod Magazine Engine Masters Challenge, Ted took the Vintage Engine Class in 2016 with a 362 cu in Y-Block that pulled 496 hp. And recently Ted took this year's award. I have attached the 2016 article but have yet to see this year's report. Ted called me in February and ordered a spacer for a Thunderbird engine he was rebuilding for a car in France (this is how I "shipped" one to France).

PICK THE RIGHT BLOCK

Ted Eaton went through six blocks to find one good one. Core shift, over-bored cylinder walls, cracks in the water jacket of the carn tower, and broken ears are just some of the things you should look out for. You should also look for the later-1961 truck blocks, which have extra webbing, John Kaase's V-block (on page 40) also uses the stouter webbed truck block. 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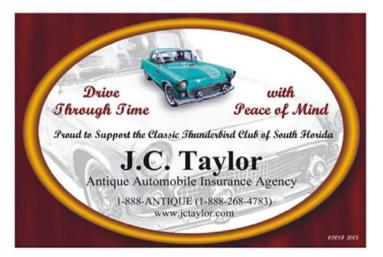
