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

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


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# How I Am Spending My Quarantine

So, Anita and I are minding our own business, when this pandemic comes along. We have gone from being social people to a couple of hermits, rarely leaving the house.

At least once a week, we take our Thunderbird out for a ride to loosen her up, often to drop off supplies to my mom at her assisted living facility. We have not been able to visit her for about four months but speak with her daily.

Meanwhile, at home I have become quite a sous chef, cutting and chopping vegetables. Occasionally I am allowed to prepare a meal.

Within one month or so, I have completed 2 years of continuing education that I need to maintain my dental license. I have read a lot, listened to a lot of music, and played a lot of 2-person canasta with Anita. We also talk a lot.

We go for a brisk walk almost every morning, and I exercise at home. I have been able to re-create most of what I had done in the gym, with an elastic band.

Things have pretty easy and stress free for us until today, but I will get to that shortly.

We had last seen our girls and grandkids during their winter vacation. We were supposed to meet them in Chicago about the time the pandemic intensified, so that trip was cancelled. We were greatly disappointed, and really started to miss them.

I thought it would be a good idea to travel by car, and meet someplace in the middle between us and Maryland where my younger daughter, Karolina, lives with her husband Tom and 3 kids, Andrew (10), Clara (8) and Rose (2 1/2). My other daughter, Lisa, would



fly to Maryland from Colorado, and quarantine in her sister's basement for a week. Karolina would not let the kids play with others for 2 weeks before the trip.

We found a house we could rent, in Mountain Rest, SC, near where SC, NC and GA meet. It was isolated on 14 acres. We would bring in our own food, and eat all meals in.

Right before we left, we took our Thunderbird for a spin. Anita and I drove up, stopping in Cordele, GA. Since they were closer, they drove it all in one day.

It was great to see them. During the day we hiked and saw a whole lot of waterfalls. They were everywhere. One day, most of us spent a couple of hours floating down the river that divides Ga and SC. Other than brief moments on trails, we never interacted with anybody.

We played games and read to Rose a lot. We ate dinner together on the huge deck every night and had a couple of campfires.

It was hard to leave, but we drove back straight through. The next night we took out the Thunderbird. It only took me three days to lose the weight I gained on the trip.

We arrived home 5 days ago. This morning my 93 year- old mother's assisted living facility sent my mother to the hospital, due to a positive COVID-19 test. Thus, the stress. There they determined that she would be fine, and was going to be discharged, but to where, as the assisted living facility will not let here back in until she has 2 negative tests. The scramble started, and we were advised that she was going to a rehab facility, for hopefully, a short while. The stress is mostly relieved.

Anita and miss you all and look forward to when we can get together again.

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






# **Happy Father's Day**

He served our country, kept the skies friendly and raised 5 kids... Here's to the man, the myth and the legend, my dad Capt. Frank Jones #gonavy #americanairlines #joneskids



Father's Day for most consists of Barbecues, opening cards, presents, and with phone calls from children spread across the globe. But for my Father's Day, and as a special treat, Bridget was going to accompany me to a car show, yes in 90- degree weather, I am blessed!

We don't drink beer, so the Corona virus was moot, and we had all the precautions for the pesky COVID-19, mask, sanitizers, and armed with social distancing rules. This being our first outing since the pandemic caused great excitement and trepidation.



We staged on our driveway to start the trek to Palm Bay for the event. Bird one in the lead and Charger 2 in trail. The day was beautiful, and the cars were both purring down I-95 South bound. A glorious beginning headed for an ignominious end. Just past the Patrick AFB exit Bird one shot out two black tinged backfires and Bridget had to do an emergency dead stick exit to the side of the road. It had been a while since we went to a car gathering and the toolbox was still in the garage. A quick diagnosis, with make-shift implements, showed the breakdown to be either ignition or mechanical, turns out it would prove to be both. A call to Triple A and a two hour wait next to the freeway eventually got the Thunderbird on the wrecker and headed for home.

Getting the operator to unload close to the garage was a challenge and as Bridget and I strained to push the bird uphill into the garage our driver disappeared, along with any chance of a gratuity.



Bridget and I quickly and initially diagnosed the problem to ignition, the rotor had chewed up the indexing pin and was slipping on the distributor shaft.


Off to the parts store and a true challenge, because, the Thunderbird has a later model 351 cubic inch Windsor under the hood. The first two parts houses could only look up parts by year make and model. I then made the long trek to Napa where an old school parts man works and scored the rotor. After quickly installing the new part, the beast would not fire! Now for the mechanical portion, we loosened the distributor and with much force and coaxing rotated the distributor 90 degrees. The engine fired and ran. Now that leaves us with either a timing chain or distributor gear failure; results to be posted in a later installment.





So high hopes ended in shattered dreams, but again the silver lining; sitting by the freeway in our show car canopy covered chairs, with Bridget keeping my spirits high is not a bad day. When we got home and Bridget was able to extricate herself from garage duties, she prepared my absolute favorite tunafish opened face sandwich, life doesn't get much better. No gold to bring home but the company of a beautiful lady and the challenge to mechanical diagnostic skills ended our day on a high note.

**Breaking Story:** When we removed the distributor to check the drive gear our inspection revealed a broken oil pump drive shaft. Next step remove the oil pan, replace oil pump and drive shaft, then decide if we need to pull the timing chain cover.....



## Father's Day, The Rest of the Story

We left this sad tale of woe with our Thunderbird off the wrecker and into our home garage. Initial inspections revealed a broken oil pump shaft and locked up oil pump; while further investigation revealed the distributor drive gear had spun on its shaft.



We needed to drop the oil pan to start the rebuild process. To remove the pan and not pull the engine, the rack and pinion power steering unit had to be lowered. With the room afforded by the steering linkage out of the way made for a relatively easy oil pan removal. The only hiccup the pan had to come out at a 20-degree list to clear the motor mounts.



With pan removed Bridget and I decided to pull the timing case cover and investigate the timing gears and chain. As a

precaution the timing gears and chain were replaced. So before reassembly we have a new oil pump, pump shaft, distributor, drive timing chain and gears, harmonic balancer, one piece oil pump gasket, and timing set seals. While this far down the rabbit hole we also replaced the water pump.







Now the initial fun part begins cleaning and painting everything, so things shine like a new copper penny. The joy of reassembly with new gleaming parts is always a thrill and even therapeutic, until something goes wrong.



Getting ready for the initial fire up of the engine we noticed a big green puddle from underneath the car, it appeared that the new water pump was leaking. We pulled the new pump, installed a new gasket, sealed the bolts that penetrate into the water jacket and then torqued everything up. Once again, a big green puddle. The definition of insanity is doing the same thing and expecting different results. I made a command decision, waved the white flag, and called Billy at Harbor Auto to get the ailing bird to his expert care.



The best we can tell by deciphering the block numbers is the 351 cubic inch Windsor that is in the engine bay came from a 1994 Ford F-150. The choice for water pumps is staggering,

there is even a reverse flow option. The myriad number of water pumps, and corresponding innumerable gasket combinations is mind boggling.

The chance of wrong parts becomes exponential. Billy and Moose were able to follow the trail and arrive at the correct combination. I told Billy that I knew the shop rate should be double as I started the repair, but he is cutting us a break.

It is reassuring having experts to back you up. I really appreciate that I got the chance to effect the repair but when I got out of my comfort level had good lads in my foxhole to assist in our mending process. The professionals at Harbor Auto are not only consummate mechanical experts but also good teachers. After all was done and the engine fired at first bump of the starter Moose took the time to show me the error of my ways so I could get it right next time. Bridget and I are grateful for the help afforded and can't wait to get Thor headed down the highway! A big Bravo Zulu to Harbor Auto Restorations.
