



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
McPherson College Summer Program & Donation

Pictured here is John Layzel presenting this year's donation check to the college, which he took up with him when he attended "summer school" at the college this year. Read all about John's exciting trip in the story that follows.

Although I'd read in various car magazines about McPherson College in Kansas, the only 4-year degree program in auto restoration in the USA, my first-hand report from somebody who had actually attended the Auto Restoration Summer Institute (aka, 'Car Camp') was about 10 -12 years ago from Thunderbird Club



and AACA member Ed Brown. His description of the college and summer course

sufficiently enthused me



to add it to my Bucket List. It wasn't until the end of 2017 that I finally signed up for June 2018. The Summer Institute commences right after the regular college Spring Term ends at the end of May. Summer Institute runs for three consecutive weeks, offering

numerous courses. Each week offers 6-7 different courses, such as engine rebuilding, tune-up and diagnostic, trim and upholstery. Classes are limited to about 10 attendees and run 8:30 AM to 5:00 PM. This year was my fourth consecutive year at McPherson, having missed 2020 when the Institute was closed because of COVID. Courses taken so far are brakes, sheet metal, woodworking and auto electrical. Except for the first and last evenings, Sunday and Friday, there is an event every evening which includes visits to private car collections, working antique machinery, auto museums, etc. Never a dull moment!

I have made a commitment to attend a class every year for as long as I am able. Gus, in my auto electrical class this year has been 10 previous times, is 84 and already planning for next year!

This year's costs were: Airfare Miami to Wichita \$470, Class \$850, Dorm \$250, Meals \$175, Shuttle to & from Wichita airport \$40 – rounded off about \$1,800.



The following year's classes and registration opens right after Thanksgiving, and the classes fill quickly! If YOU are a true gearhead, you own it to yourself to spend a least one week at the 'Car Camp.' 
















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Alan and Helen's Great Adventure – Part 1

The sneakiest issue we always have with the Great Race (this is the sixth time we've done it) is....the lead time! We all happily agreed to do this at least six months ago, so the need to prepare certainly hasn't been a surprise. However, at least one of us (hint: it's not Helen...) likes to put everything off until the last possible moment.

First of all..... I pondered for months whether to take the truck (a 1946 Dodge one-ton) or the Austin-Healey (a 1967 BJ8). The truck is roomy (it is a truck, after all), cool and breezy, but very slow to accelerate and hard to steer and stop. The Healey is agile, powerful, fast and wonderfully noisy, but very tiny, hot and uncomfortable.

Eventually, since the route this year starts in Rhode Island and proceeds through hilly country all the way to North Dakota, we decided that the truck deserves a vacation!! It hates hills as it has to crawl up them (usually in second or third gear), so we lose a whole lot of time (which Helen keeps track of....along with our new slower speed.... on her stopwatch) and then we floor it going back downhill at a much higher speed until Helen says we've recovered the lost time.

WHEW!!! It all fits!!

Finally, after breathing a sigh of relief that everything fits, Helen and I did a bunch of test runs with the fully loaded vehicle, and Helen analyzed and updated our navigation charts to reflect time loss during turns, speed changes, following slower vehicles, and stops with the Healey fully loaded:



A LIFE OF THUNDERBIRDS, by Gina Crochet as told by Richard Crochet

"How many Thunderbirds have you owned?" I asked him. "Seven, including the current one," he replied. My curiosity was peaked so I continued. "What year was your first?" "It was a 1959," he said; "I bought it when I was 19 year old." "What drew you to it?" I inquired. The laws of attraction are always of interest to me. He confirmed it was the look. The car was so different from anything else in the showrooms of the day. He remembered the first time he saw one was at church one Sunday. The new 1958 belonged to a family of four – mommy, daddy and two kids all dressed in their church clothes looking so perfect in the car. I understood because he was the only child raised by a single father. The Ford commercials described the car as having a spirit of luxury but sized to fit four comfortably. "Everyone wants to own one," the ads touted. He admitted it was true. He did want to own one but it took until 1963 for it to become a reality.

The car was a white 1959 Thunderbird with the iconic turquoise and white interior – so 1950's. I know he



babied it in the same way he has all his cars. He also believes they need to be driven and this one would be on the move. It was truly the daily driver but great for touring. Travel was terrific, and one of the road trips from New Orleans to Key West gave him a taste of Florida in the winter that would eventually draw him back.

Soon a job opportunity presented itself at a Ford dealership in San Diego. By that time, the 1959 was joined by a fabulous blue 1966 Q Code Landau, which towed the '59 on

the trip to California. Tragedy struck in the middle of the Texas desert with a failed water pump and a fried engine. The trusty '59 became the tow car and pulled the '66 into San Diego. "What happened to it?" I asked. His answer was –"I rebuilt the engine in my spare time." I marvel at his ability to do something that significant. I was impressed with this off-handed response as if it was the most natural thing to do.

He said he loved San Diego. "Why did you leave?" I asked. "Life happened," he said, "and 'she' wanted to move back to her



family." I wasn't sure who 'she' was – wife or girlfriend; but it seemed of no consequence since we had already been together for thirty-three years. I did not pursue it. I know some New Orleanans have strong attachments to family, gumbo and jazz. They returned to New Orleans with the '59 again pulling the '66 across Texas to Louisiana. This time the trip was uneventful.

I wanted to hear more and asked about the next Thunderbird – a dark green 1969 with a black interior. He gave me the look that said he had had enough of the drive down memory lane and I knew the discussion was better left for another day. There were five more Birds, four more states and many more years in the saga of his life of Thunderbirds. I can't wait for the next installment!






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
