The International Thunderbird Club (ITC) is open to all 1955 to 2005 Thunderbird owners and enthusiasts along with other T-Bird club organizations. Numerous ITC members, including me, belong to CTCI and VTCI.

ITC encourages all clubs to join the other clubs to help support the Thunderbird, share ideas, T-Birds, and technical advice. ITC has one of the largest Thunderbird Facebook pages in the world with over 4,400 T-Bird Facebook members posting daily from around the world.

Numerous CTCI and VTCI chapters have joined ITC. Last year the ITC/VTCI chapter, Hoosier Vintage Thunderbird Club, hosted the ITC chapter. This year the convention will be hosted by ITC/CTCI chapter Buffalo Thunderbird Club. ITC/CTCI chapter Pitt Birds Thunderbird Club has stated that they are happy with the support ITC's provides them. 



move in while they are here! [We need a bigger house!] The included photos





This story is about how ALL the International Thunderbird Clubs on the planet came together for a "United Nations of Thunderbird" at Thunderbird the Reunion in Dearborn Michigan USA, August 22-26th 2023. The brainchild of the prolific President of ITC, The Thunderbird Club, International Bart Bartasavich, this gathering of all the Thunderbird Clubs at the Ford World Headquarters has been years in the making. After retiring from the ITC Presidents position, he held for 8 years in 2019 and achieving Club Facebook а membership of over 8.000 members from an original 50, Bart



began working on a Thunderbird Reunion for ALL Thunderbird owners world-wide. Originally it was planned for 2020 with AFN, All Ford Nationals, but as things worked out the Covid Pandemic had other plans for his dream. Not to be deterred, with years of planning and organizing, and his wife Vera by his side, in the Fall of 2022 Bart was again putting out feelers to the ITC Membership for a Thunderbird Reunion in 2023. The Local ITC Clubs, Water Wonderland Thunderbird Club and American Open Road Thunderbird Club jumped at the chance to sponsor the Reunion and a date was set! Now the hard work began, putting out the word to all the Thunderbird Clubs and their membership about this GOAT Thunderbird gathering. The Clubs invited included members of CTCI-Classic Thunderbird Club International, Brian Carron President. VTCI-Vintage Thunderbird Club, Rod Wake President. TBN-Thunderbird Nest, Bob Sinickas (Thunderbird Bob) Founder and of course ITC- International Thunderbird Club, Bart Bartasavich, President (now through his tireless efforts, with over 23,000 Facebook Members) and it worked!

Attending the Event week were 400 people in total and on the Reunion Day, 250 people displayed their Thunderbirds, bringing them from as far as Texas, Florida, New Jersey, Canada and further.

The festivities started with an impromptu dinner (Bart was already working his magic) for the early arrivals on Tuesday the 22nd at Ford's Garage. We got to display Club Cars in front of the restaurant right on Michigan Ave!







Wednesday night we all attended a "welcome dinner" at the Double Tree Hilton which was the host Hotel. We all had a wonderful time getting to know fellow Thunderbird Club owners from all over the USA, Canada and even as far away as Australia, Darryl Heiner! Both Chairman, Bart Bartasavich and Dr. Steven Legel gave stirring welcoming speeches and we were introduced to the Local ITC Chapter Officers who were invaluable in making the Thunderbird Reunion Event successful. Guest Speaker John Clor from Ford Performance & Club Connect informed us about how important we Thunderbird owners are to the FORD Culture and gave us a glimpse into what Ford Performance is all about, now and in the future.



Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday we were on our own to explore Dearborn and Detroit. Arlene and I went to the Ford Museum, Ford Rouge Plant Tour, and the Ford Piquette Plant. After the modernity of the Rouge Plant, the Piquette Plant, state of the art in 1904, was so primitive it was like seeing "Kit Cars" assembled. It is amazing to consider 14,000 Model T Fords were built there!















A special treat was attending the Ford Tri-motor Event at the Yankee Air Museum. Originally those who wanted could take a ride in one of the last flying Tri-Motors and relive the pioneering days of commercial air travel, but the weather grounded her. Making Lemonade from Lemons, Bart arranged a Photo Op of members' cars with the Tri-Motor!







Thunderbird Education was not left out. A real magic trick was performed when a 1961 Convertible in mid-restoration was brought into the Hotel lobby! Bullet Bird owners had a field-day getting answers to some interesting questions. Thursday morning there were 2 Clinics, Square Birds and FE Engine systems health by Rick Charniga and organizer David Lau, Reto-Birds about FEMs and REMs with Dr. Steve Legel and "Thunderbird Bob" Sinickas. I attended Rick and Dave's class and learned a lot about auto electronics. I'll keep my original point set-up in the 55, thank you! I wish I could have cloned myself to attend Dr. Steve Legel's (ITC Club Retro Bird Technical Advisor) class with Thunderbird Bob, who is the country's leading source for Retro-Bird parts. There was also a presentation at Roush Headquarters by Larry Seyfarth, who was instrumental in the development of Ford's 427cu. in. High Performance engine program. He had some great stories about racing up and down Telegraph Ave back in the day. The guys who went up against him never knew what was under his

A special invitation to attend a Wine and Chocolate party at Dr. Steven Legal's Car Chocolate party at Dr. Steven Legal's Car Collection was extended to selected members by mail about a week before the Reunion and Arlene and I were among the Lucky ones. Dr Legel has a renowned collection of Thunderbird automobilia, filling over 10 rooms in a recovered local mid-century neighborhood bowling alley, which in itself was remarkable. I imagined Ralph Kramden and Ed Norton there on Bowling night. In the collection are Tin, Polystyrene, Diecast, Resin, Ceramic, and every other kind of media Thunderbird cars of all different years, along with model kits, medals, belt buckles, pins, tags, games, pens, pencils, placemats, towels, even a toilet paper dispenser! The library room contained hundreds of books and artwork. It was astounding! We were able to spend some time speaking with Dr. Legel about his cars, and his automobilia. He is very affable and eager to answer any question about his collection. The Collection is featured in the Michael Lamm publication Thunderbird 2002 (Lamm-Moranda Inc. 2002), fully illustrated in Chapter 5.




All the iterations of Thunderbirds were represented at the Thunderbird Reunion.





That afternoon we went to the Sloan Museum. Their car collection was small, but they were arranged to tell a story. There was an interesting exhibit about the development of the child safety seat.

We were next off to Ypsilanti. The Yankee Air Museum was small as most of the larger planes were not viewable, but they did have an

excellent exhibit on Rosie the Riveter and the role of women in the war effort. We then went to the Michigan Firehouse Museum which was very impressive, followed by the Hudson Museum.



We then drove to Auburn, IN. We started there with the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Museum. Impressive as the car collection was, the building is equally impressive.
